

Humanities Teacher - Middle School

The Lycee International is located on a beautiful campus in the chateau town of St. Germain-en-Laye, approximately 45 minutes by public transportation from the center of Paris. Founded in 1952 for children of NATO, the school is now an international school in the French lycée system with 14 international sections. Students take literature and history in their native tongue and spend 80% of their time in classes taught by the French. It is a truly bicultural and bilingual environment, and one of the top-rated schools in the country.

The American Section, a private international section within the Lycée International is seeking a fulltime Middle School teacher starting in the 2022-2023 school year.

The Middle School teacher will be responsible for teaching both Language Arts and Social Studies to students in grades 6 through 9 as well as supervise the Upper School's Model United Nations program. A a deep understanding of literature, history, politics, and culture is required, as is the ability to teach analytical writing, critical thinking, and research skills. American Section teachers are dynamic team players who thrive in a demanding environment committed to academic excellence and who welcome the opportunity to teach motivated, bilingual students. Candidates must be also independent, innovative, hardworking, and creative. An appreciation for young adolescents and a sense of humor are essential.

Applicants must possess an undergraduate degree in a related field (an advanced degree is preferred) and have five years of teaching experience, preferably at the middle school level. As this position is an integral part of the secondary teaching team, the candidate would be additionally qualified to teach grades 10-12. As the American Section is one part of a larger French school, a solid working knowledge of French is a must.

Deadline for application is May 8, 2022. This position begins in late August 2022.
